Scheduling breach forces Feb. 5 Antrim County COVID-19 clinic cancelation

The Health Department of Northwest Michigan was forced to cancel one clinic this week because an online scheduling link was shared. The breach by someone outside of the health department allowed people to register out-of-turn for the vaccination clinic on February 5 in Antrim County.

Personal medical records and other information were not compromised or accessed.

"This is extremely regrettable and is forcing us to cancel all our appointments for this February 5 clinic and reschedule them at a later date," said Lisa Peacock, Health Officer for the Health Department of Northwest Michigan. "This breach is requiring us to postpone appointments for those who did legitimately sign up and making us pull valuable resources to address this issue."

About 280 of the 300 appointment slots available were filled by residents from neighboring counties or even from across the state of Michigan, Peacock said.

The health department advises the public to not share any scheduling links with friends, family, or acquaintances. The COVID-19 vaccine doses are limited, and appointments are scheduled to match availability.
